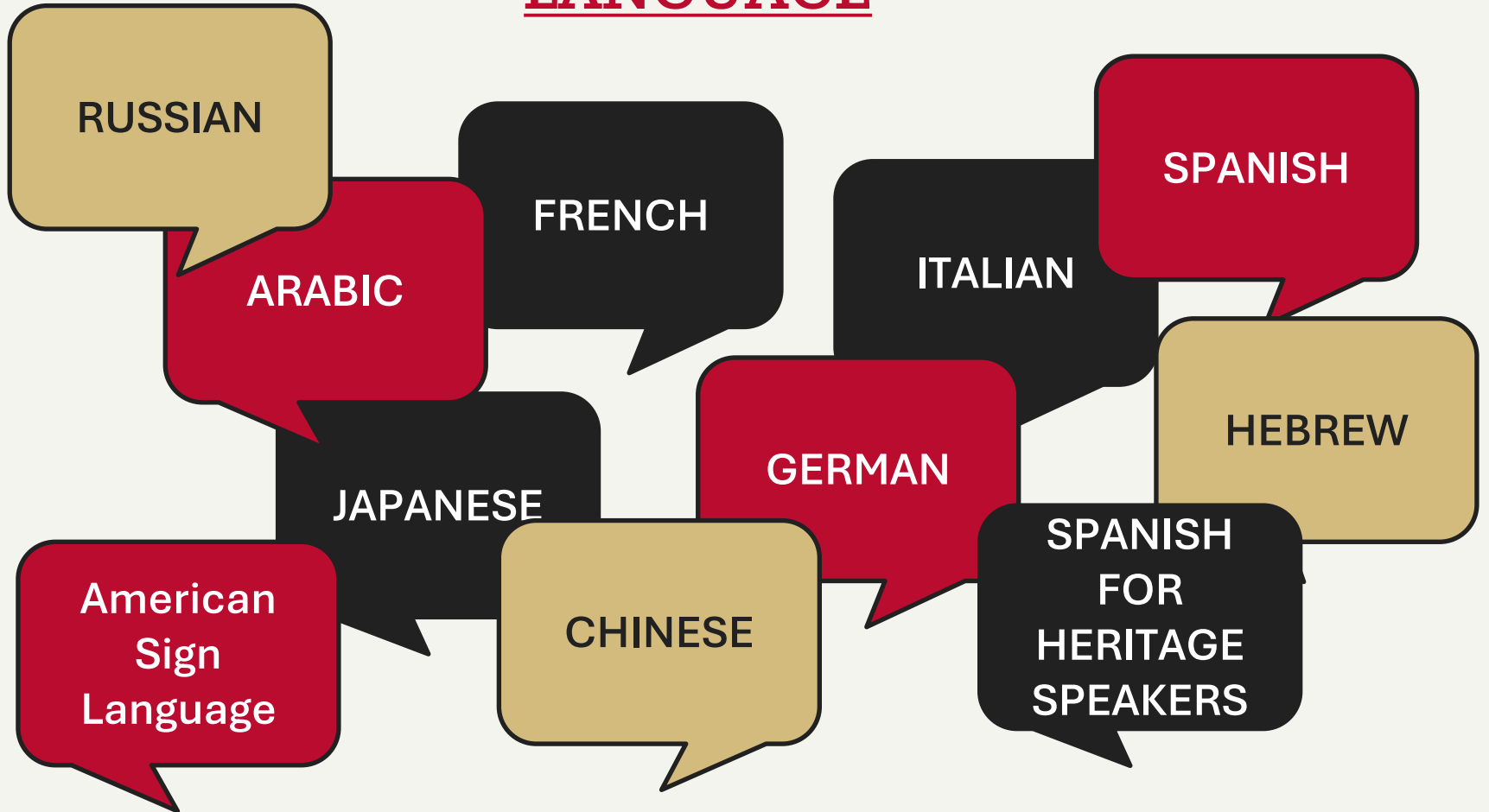

LANGUAGE PLACEMENT

- **THE PLACEMENT IS ONE TOOL TO HELP YOU FIND THE BEST MATCH FOR YOUR BACKGROUND.**
 - You can take the French, German, Russian, and Spanish placements up to 5 times within a 7-day window.
 - The Center for World Languages and Cultures (CWLC) recommends students take the French and Spanish placement 2-3 times. The highest score will be the one that determines placement.
 - Other language placements cannot be taken more than once.

Timing Considerations for Language

1. If you are considering adding a language as a major or minor, we recommend starting your language sequence in your first year.
2. Study Abroad Considerations: Some programs have a higher language proficiency requirement in order to be considered for acceptance into the program.
