Synopsis:

On Friday, March 13th, at approximately 4:57 AM, Campus Safety identified an individual attempting to get access to the Driscoll Center by breaking the card reader. Campus Safety Officers and Denver Police responded, and Denver Police arrested the individual. Later that day, Campus Safety received information that the same individual allegedly attempted to sexually assault and did fondle a student prior to the incident at Driscoll. We have learned that the alleged perpetrator has been released from Denver Police custody. Due to an ongoing law enforcement investigation, additional details cannot be released.

Campus Safety is sending this alert pursuant to the Clery Act because we believe there may be a continued threat to our campus community.

Safety and Security Tips:

These safety and security tips are strategies for reducing risk, and victimization is never the fault of the victim/survivor.

1. **Travel in groups at night and consider using the safe walk feature on the DU Safe App.**
2. **Perpetrators choose victims for their vulnerability, not based on how they look or act. Sexual assault is never the victim's fault. Only the perpetrator chooses to commit sexual assault.**
3. **Be active in supporting a safe and respectful community. If you see others engaging in disrespectful or inappropriate actions, speak up and get involved, or contact someone else to assist.**
