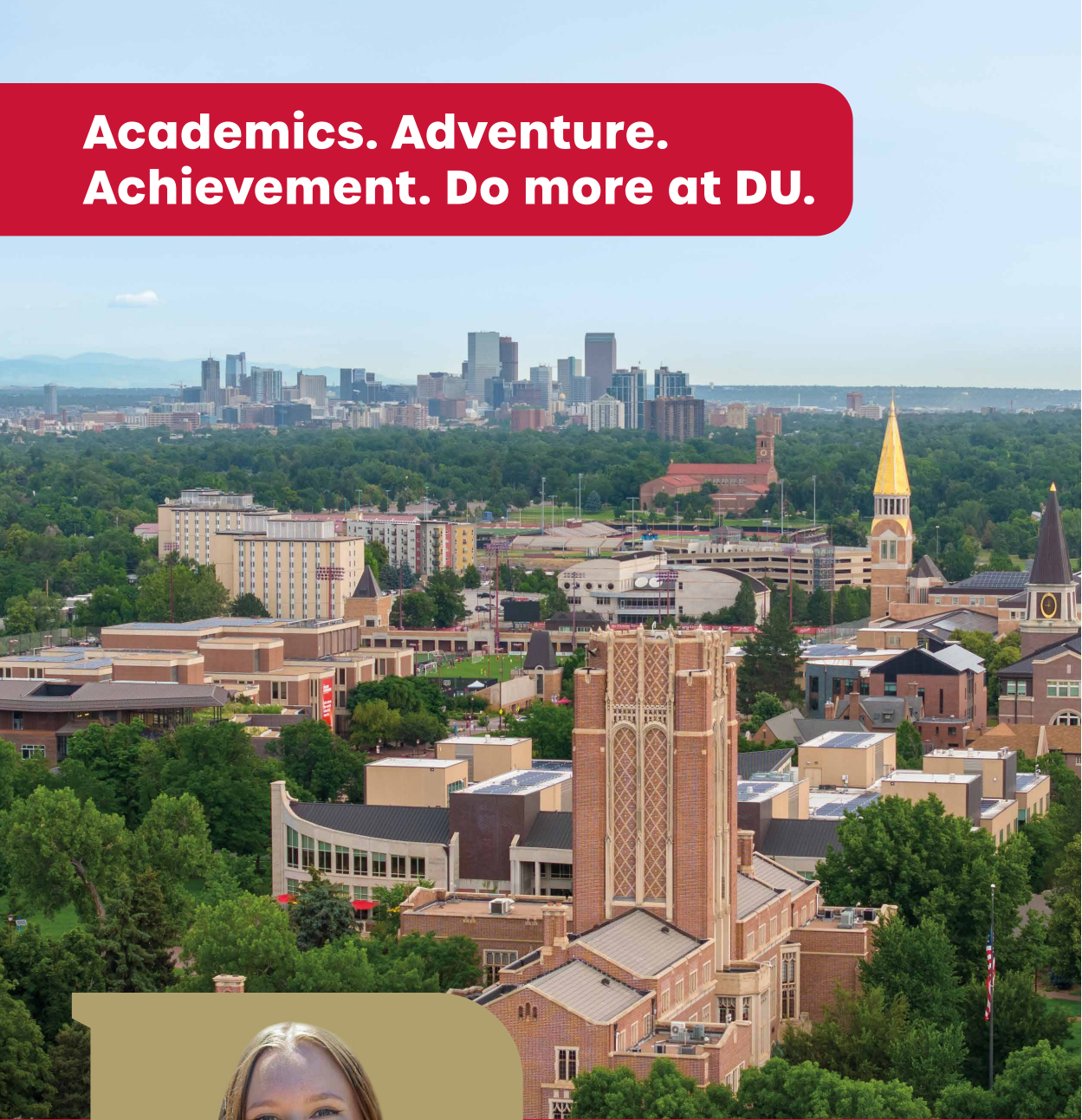

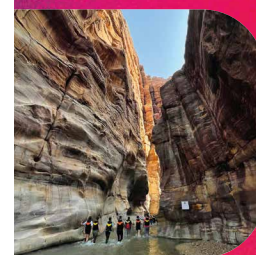
At DU, you don't have to wait until grad school to make research count. We're classified as an R1 Research University, placing us among the nation's top institutions for high-impact research.

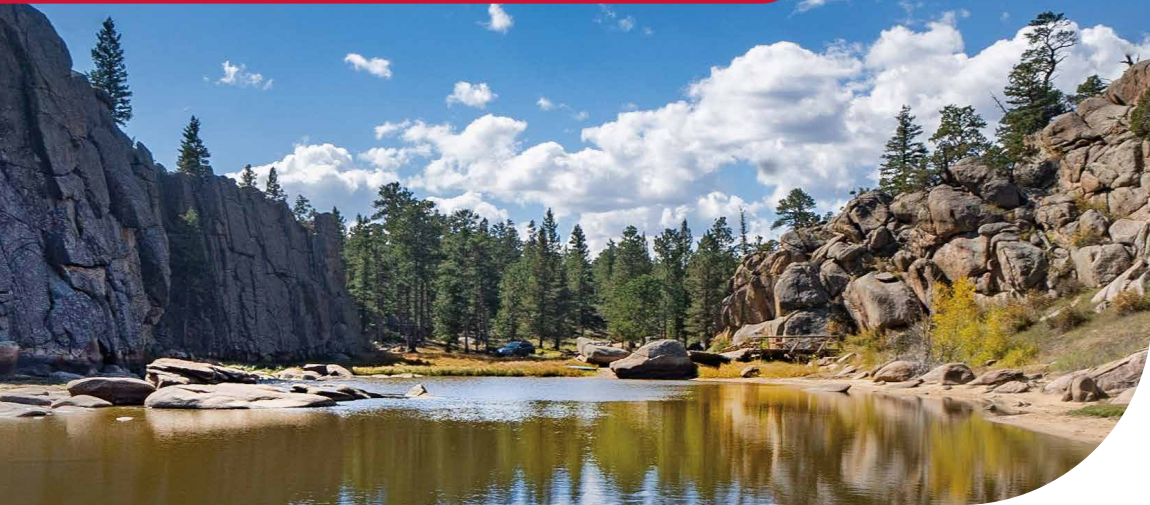

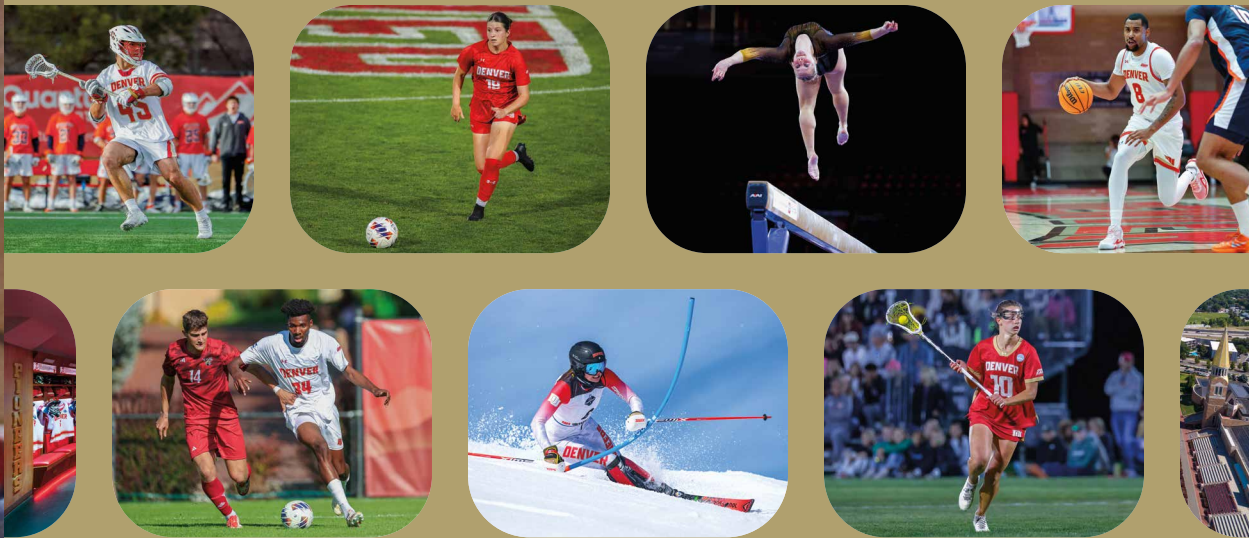
