## Here are some guidelines for virtual learning in our online community (middle school):

Please remember you are in a virtual classroom, with that in mind, appropriate classroom behavior is expected.

- 1. Log in to your online experience from a distraction-free and quiet place using your real name.
- 2. Make eye contact with the camera (the camera is the class!)
- 3. Find your light! Make sure there is a light source in front of you, not behind
- 4. Speak in a conversational tone you won't need to raise your voice
- 5. Keep your audio on mute until told to speak. This helps with background noise and allows everyone to participate.
- 6. Use the raise hand feature if you need to ask a question. Then unmute yourself once you are called upon.
- 7. If the chat box is used, understand it is public and the record of chat is archived. Comments should pertain only to the lesson that is taking place.
- 8. Make sure you are prepared for the class daily.
- 9. Refrain from using backgrounds while class is in session.
- 10. Your posture should be upright with attention being paid to the viewing screen.
